
## 2020 AQHI Ratings in Alberta

In Alberta, all monitoring stations saw low risk range of 90% to 100% of the 2020 year, with a provincial average AQHI reading of 2.0 (based on 311,770 hours of data).



Exposure to air pollution may result in a variety of health effects ranging from slight discomfort to increased hospital admissions and emergency room visits, to increased risk of premature death. In particular, individuals with respiratory and cardiovascular conditions, children and the elderly may notice symptoms due to poor air quality conditions.
